Short Term Consultant – Human Resources for Health / Health Policy and Integrated Planning

About HRH/ HPIP division: The Human Resources for Health/ Health Policy and Integrated Planning division of NHSRC focuses on providing support and technical assistance to the MoHFW and to the states in strengthening HRH, policies regarding health systems strengthening and integrated planning.

The team has been supporting the states in:

- Developing comprehensive strategies for HRH,
- Strengthening HR cell at state level through capacity building for comprehensive management of all staff,
- Devising strategies for improving planning, recruitment and retention of HRH, workforce management and performing salary rationalization.

- Support states in strengthening their HRH planning and management practices.
- Undertake other assignments, which may be assigned from time to time by the Reporting Officer.
