 - vi. The HR positions are approved to the extent as mentioned in the Section-V under Chapter-2.5, Section 4.1.6, 4.2.2, 5.2.1, 5.2.2, 5.3, 5.4.1, 5.4.5, 6.5.8, 7.5.4 and 7.5.5 under respective Component of the Operational Guidelines of PM-ABHIM.
 - vii. The release of the Central share will be based on fulfillment of necessary conditions such as submission of UCs and expenditure reports as per extant Rules and instructions of the Central Government in this regard. All processes for fund release, expenditure and Submission of UCs will be as mentioned in Chapter 2.6 of the Operational Guidelines of PM-ABHIM.
 - viii. The States shall submit Monthly progress on the implementation and update in the Progress Monitoring System (PMS) as mentioned in Chapter-2.7 of the operational Guidelines of PM-ABHIM.
 - ix.All approvals are subject to the conditions mentioned in the Operational guidelines of PM-ABHIM for respective components.
