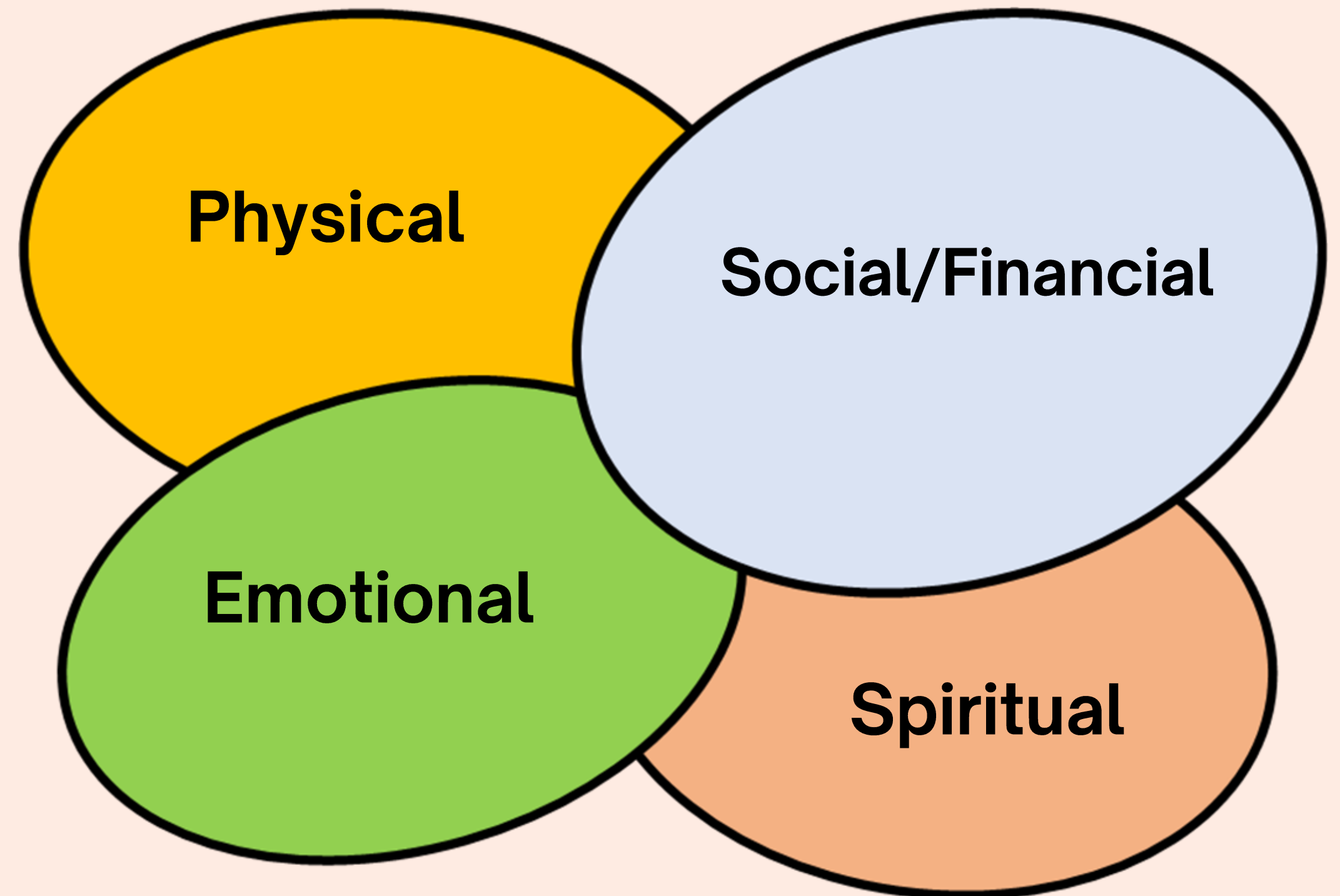

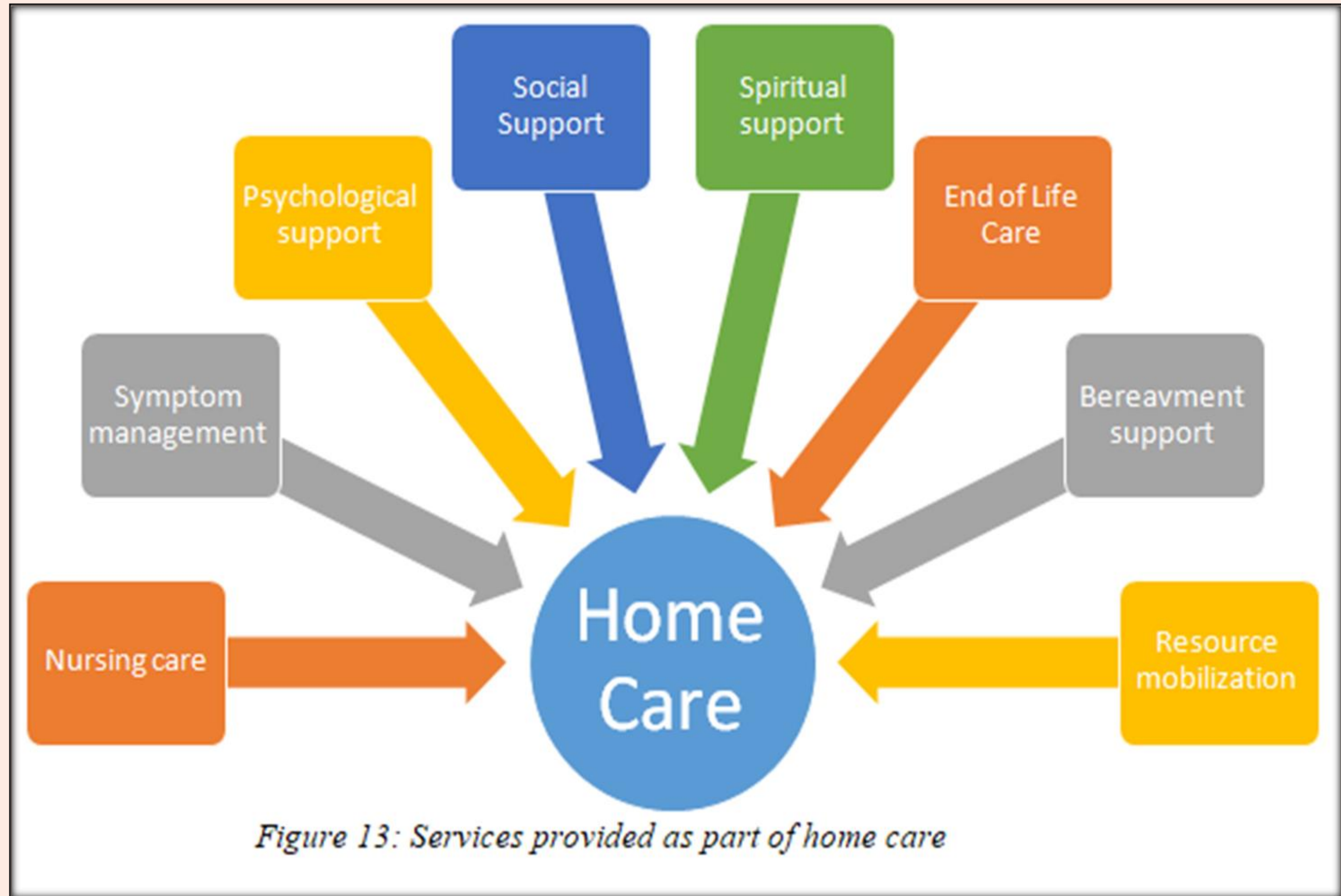

COMPOSITION

Equipment Stethoscope, forceps, BP Apparatus, Tongue Depressors, Torch, Thermometer	Pain Control Paracetamol, Diclofenac, Ibuprofen, Tramadol
Supplies Dressing Supplies, Gloves, Cotton, Micropore, Tapes, Scissors, Syringes & Needles, Gauze, Pieces, Condom Catheters, Gauze bandages, Urine Bags, Dressing Trays, Feeding Tubes	Wound Management Betadine & Lotion Ointment, Metrogyl Jelly, Hydrogen Peroxide
Gastrointestinal Symptom Management Domperidone, Oral Rehydration Salts, Bisacodyl, Ranitidine, Loperamide	Antibiotics and Antifungals Ciprofloxacin, Amoxycillin, Metronidazole, Fluconazole
Psychological Symptom Management Lorazepam, Amitriptyline	Nutritional Supplements Iron, Vitamin and Mineral Supplements Miscellaneous Spirit, Deriphylline, Lignocaine Jelly, Ethamsylate, Cough Preparations

HOME- CARE/ROLE OF DOCTORS

- Home visits to relieve serious health-related suffering
- Support in serious psycho-social distress
- Training of personnel & coordination of care
- Procedures like NG tube insertion
- Prescribe & document medicines including opioids
- Referral and linkage services
