PALLIATIVE CARE NEEDS IN HIV/AIDS AND CHRONIC DISEASES

- Several chronic diseases are associated with prolonged immobility, associated infections, pain, and comorbidities and require symptom management.
- These patients require palliative care services.
 - HIV/AIDS
 - Cancer
 - Neurological disorders (Parkinson's disease, Multiple sclerosis, Stroke)
 - Alzheimer's disease, dementia
 - Progressive systemic diseases (COPD, chronic liver and kidney disease)



















SYMPTOMS IN HIV/AIDS & CHRONIC DISEASES

Diarrhoea, fever, weight loss, nausea, dyspnoea, skin breakdown, cognitive


Pain, organ system dysfunction, fever, weight loss, immobility

Paralysis, impairment, immobility, disturbance in speech/ vision

Cognitive impairment, behavioral symptoms, dependence

Dyspnoea, cough, fever, weight loss

Fatigue, weight loss, nausea, vomiting, chest pain, dyspnoea, hypertension



















GOALS OF PALLIATIVE CARE IN HIV/AIDS AND CHRONIC DISEASES

- 1. To relieve symptoms and maximize the level of functioning and quality of life
- 2. To relieve physical discomfort
- 3. To provide emotional and spiritual support
- 4. To train the patient/ family in self-care by actively participating in the care plan
- 5. To provide counselling regarding healthy living
- 6. To aid in the acceptance of sickness and its consequences



SCOPE OF PALLIATIVE CARE IN HIV/AIDS AND CHRONIC DISEASES

Clinical care:

- Prevention and treatment of the disease
- Prevention and treatment of other comorbidities and Opportunistic Infections
- Alleviation of related symptoms and pain

Psychological care:

- Mental health counselling
- Diagnosis and treatment of related psychiatric illnesses, depression and related anxieties
- Support groups
- Bereavement services


















SCOPE OF PALLIATIVE CARE IN HIV/AIDS AND CHRONIC DISEASES


Spiritual care:

 Culturally sensitive services that support individuals and families through faith and rituals.

Supportive care: Assists individuals and families to link with the following services:

- Child care
- Adherence to treatment
- Food support
- Income generation
- Legal services rights, inheritance





















EXAMPLE OF PALLIATIVE CARE ISSUES IN HIV/AIDS

Opportunistic infections and co-morbidities: Hepatitis B & C, oral candidiasis, malignancies of the skin and connective tissue, infections of the brain, pneumonia, tuberculosis.

Pain in HIV/AIDS

- Due to HIV infections: pneumonia, meningitis, skin infections, oral infections, lymphadenopathy, Kaposi's sarcoma and lymphomas.
- Due to treatment: Procedures, ART causing neuropathy or myopathy, pancreatitis etc. and radiotherapy for malignancies.
- Due to debilitation: Pressure sores, constipation, musculoskeletal pain from wasting and inactivity.

Side effects of Anti Retroviral Therapy.

















EXAMPLE OF PALLIATIVE CARE ISSUES IN HIV/AIDS

Psychosocial issues such as psychiatric illness, cognitive impairment and substance abuse.

Spiritual issues related to life limiting illness/ diseases largely compromising quality of life.

Supportive care:

- Counseling regarding healthy lifestyle, good nutrition, adherence to medicines, side effects of medicines, support in Activities of Daily Living.
- Self-care activities using resources available at home.
- Child care, food support, income generation support.
- Linkage to specialist care.

Disproportionately affects marginalized populations – delayed treatment, less access.
